Re: **NCCI Item B-1450 – Revisions to Basic Manual Classifications for Hazardous Material Remediation and Military Reservation Construction - Iron or Steel Erection - Not Over Two Stories in Height**

Overview

Item B-1450 revises classification phraseology related to hazardous material remediation operations involving asbestos, mold, and lead paint, and also revises phraseology related to military reservation construction and certain janitorial and cleanup operations. This item is effective on and after July 15, 2026, for new and renewal policies.

Key Changes & MWCIA Actions

- Phraseology revisions to codes 5472, 5473, and 5474 adding the word mold.
 - Changes show that they apply to asbestos **and mold** removal or encapsulation, including certain cleaning and construction work performed as part of those operations, while requiring separate rating for construction work performed after remediation has concluded.
- The filing also adds phraseology for lead paint abatement operations under Code 5474.
- Phraseology revisions to Code 5059 so it applies to iron or steel erection performed in connection with the construction or repair of military reservation buildings.
- Phraseology revisions to Code 9014 language to clarify treatment of janitorial services, cleanup crews preparing residential properties for future occupants, waterproofing operations performed by apparatus inserted in the ground, and the exclusion of construction debris removal from Code 9014.
 - It also emphasizes that employees of a construction company who perform janitorial-type cleaning before, during, or after construction are treated as miscellaneous employees of the construction company and assigned to the governing classification of the business.

Industry Impact

These revisions may affect classification assignment, audit treatment, and premium calculations for some employers. Payroll may be transferred among Codes 5472, 5473, and 5474, from remediation classifications to applicable construction classifications, or from janitorial classifications to the governing classification of the construction business depending on the facts of the work performed and the employer's records.

For ease of reference, the filing materials include exhibits showing the revised phraseology for the affected class codes. Members should review the exhibit language carefully.

Countrywide—Announcement of Item B-1450—Revisions to Basic Manual Classifications for Hazardous Material Remediation and Military Reservation—Construction—Iron or Steel Erection—Not Over Two Stories in Height

ACTION NEEDED

Please review the changes outlined in the attachment to this circular for impact on your company's systems and procedures. Also, review the weekly *Status of Item Filings* circular for state approval of this item.

Note: Arkansas law does not permit NCCI to file rules and rates on its members' behalf. Therefore, insurance carriers must make an independent filing with the Arkansas Insurance Department electing to adopt, or not adopt, an item filing filed by NCCI and subsequently approved by the Department. When such a filing is made with the Department, make sure that the NCCI item filing number (not the NCCI circular number) is referenced.

BACKGROUND

NCCI has submitted Item B-1450—Revisions to Basic Manual Classifications for Hazardous Material Remediation and Military Reservation—Construction—Iron or Steel Erection—Not Over Two Stories in Height to the appropriate state regulatory authorities.

This item is applicable to new and renewal policies and is proposed to become effective on and after January 1, 2026, in all states indicated in the filing except Hawaii and Texas. In Hawaii, the effective date is determined upon regulatory approval of the individual carrier's election to adopt this change. In Texas, this item is proposed to become effective on or after July 1, 2026.

Additionally, this item has been submitted to certain independent bureaus for their consideration.

This item proposes to revise the

- treatment of classifications related to hazardous material remediation services for asbestos, mold, and lead paint in NCCI's *Basic Manual for Workers Compensation and Employers Liability Insurance (Basic Manual)*, and
- phraseology for Code 5059—Military Reservation—Construction—Iron or Steel Erection—Not Over Two Stories in Height in NCCI's *Basic Manual*.

Additionally, this item clarifies the classification treatment for employees of construction companies that perform janitorial-type services.

Refer to the attachment for details on this item, including all state-specific treatments.

IMPACT

The proposed revisions to NCCI's *Basic Manual* as a result of this item may result in a decrease, an increase, or no change in employer premium. There is expected to be little movement of payroll and, hence, no large impacts to premium since the updates to the multistate phraseology for each classification clarify when the identified classifications apply on a policy. Due to the clarifications added to Code 5472, Code 5473, and Code 5474, some payroll may transfer amongst all three classifications and from Code 5472 and Code 5473 to the appropriate construction classification. Due to the clarifications added to Code 9014 and Code 9170, some payroll may transfer from Code 9014 and Code 9170 to the governing classification of the business.

The amount of payroll that may transfer cannot be identified using current industry data sources. The impact to individual employers will depend on the amount of payroll (if any) that transfers from classification to classification as well as their associated rates and loss costs.

The clarification proposed for Code 5059 is not expected to result in any payroll movement.

The statewide premium resulting from the proposed changes is not quantifiable but is expected to be negligible.

Purpose

This item revises the

- treatment for classifications related to hazardous material remediation services for asbestos, mold, and lead paint in NCCI's **Basic Manual for Workers Compensation and Employers Liability Insurance (Basic Manual)**, and
- phraseology for Code 5059—Military Reservation—Construction—Iron or Steel Erection—Not Over Two Stories in Height in NCCI's **Basic Manual**.

Additionally, this item clarifies the classification treatment for employees of construction companies that perform janitorial-type services.

Background**Hazardous Material Remediation**

Hazardous asbestos, mold, and lead paint can be present on materials or surfaces in various forms. For instance, they may be found in porous building materials, such as sheets of drywall that are covered in an organic fungus, like black mold. Manufactured products may contain asbestos, or a painted surface could be covered in lead paint. The remediation operations for these hazardous materials have evolved over the years, incorporating new methods that can vary depending on the specific materials and conditions involved. Several different trades can be involved in addressing a major issue, but there are also full-service remediation companies that can manage the entire process. The tools and equipment used in handling these hazardous materials are often the same or similar, and the remediation processes share similar hazards, injury risks, and disease potential. Asbestos and mold remediation processes involve assessing the severity of the contamination through inspections, erecting containment barriers, encapsulating or removing the asbestos or mold, and finally reinspecting the area.

NCCI's current classification system does not adequately address many of these new hazardous material remediation operations. NCCI determined that clarification is needed for the following classifications, which are currently assigned to asbestos, mold, and lead paint remediation operations:

1. Code 5472—Asbestos Removal Operations—Contractor—Pipe and Boiler Work Exclusively & Drivers
2. Code 5473—Asbestos Removal Operations—Contractor—NOC & Drivers
3. Code 5474—Painting NOC & Shop Operations, Drivers

In addition, certain additional codes related to asbestos, mold, and lead paint remediation need to be revised to ensure clarity and consistency between the codes.

Construction Company Miscellaneous Employees

According to NCCI's **Basic Manual** rule, Rule for assigning miscellaneous employees to the governing classification, "[Carriers] must assign the governing classification to miscellaneous employees who perform duties that are commonly conducted for separate operations that are subject to more than one basic classification." NCCI's **Basic Manual** rule, Governing classifications, states: "The governing classification at a specific job or location is the basic classification, other than a standard exception classification."

NCCI determined that clarification is needed for the following classifications to clarify that employees of a construction company that perform janitorial-type services are included as miscellaneous employees of the construction company and are assigned to the governing classification of the business.

1. Code 9014—Janitorial Services by Contractors—No Window Cleaning Above Ground Level & Drivers

2. Code 9170—Janitorial Services by Contractors—Includes Window Cleaning Above Ground Level & Drivers

Military Reservation Construction

Item B-1444—NCCI's Basic Manual for Workers Compensation and Employers Liability Insurance introduced a new edition of NCCI's **Basic Manual**.¹ Since the implementation of Item B-1444, NCCI has completed a review of Code 5059 in NCCI's **Basic Manual**. This review identified that the phraseology for Code 5059—Military Reservation—Construction—Iron or Steel Erection—Not Over Two Stories in Height needs to be updated to reflect that this code is not restricted to the construction or repair of buildings designed for the housing and welfare of personnel. Instead, Code 5059 is assigned to all types of iron or steel erection not over two stories in height that are performed in connection with the construction or repair of military reservation buildings.

Proposal

This item proposes the following revisions in NCCI's **Basic Manual**:

1. Revise the phraseology for Code 5472—Asbestos Removal Operations—Contractor—Pipe and Boiler Work Exclusively & Drivers to clarify the operations included within this phraseology
2. Revise the phraseology for Code 5473—Asbestos Removal Operations—Contractor—NOC & Drivers to reflect mold removal operations and clarify the operations included within this phraseology
3. Establish a new phraseology for Lead Paint Abatement & Shop Operations, Drivers in Code 5474 to address the removal or sealing of lead-painted surfaces
4. Revise the phraseology for Code 9014—Janitorial Services by Contractors—No Window Cleaning Above Ground Level & Drivers to clarify the classification of miscellaneous employees of a construction company who perform janitorial-type services
5. Revise the phraseology for Code 9170—Janitorial Services by Contractors—Includes Window Cleaning Above Ground Level & Drivers to clarify the classification of miscellaneous employees of a construction company who perform janitorial-type services
6. Revise the phraseology for Code 5059—Military Reservation—Construction—Iron or Steel Erection—Not Over Two Stories in Height to clarify that Code 5059 is assigned to all types of iron or steel erection not over two stories in height that are performed in connection with the construction or repair of military reservation buildings

Impact

The proposed revisions to NCCI's **Basic Manual** as a result of this item may result in a decrease, an increase, or no change in employer premium. There is expected to be little movement of payroll and, hence, no large impacts to premium since the updates to the multistate phraseology for each classification is a clarification of when the identified classifications apply on a policy.

Due to the clarifications added to Code 5472, Code 5473, and Code 5474, some payroll may transfer amongst all three classifications and from Code 5472 and Code 5473 to the appropriate construction classification.

Due to the clarifications added to Code 9014 and Code 9170, some payroll may transfer from Code 9014 and Code 9170 to the governing classification of the business.

State-Specific Proposals and Impacts

In addition to the above multistate proposals, NCCI proposes the following state-specific revisions:

Florida Proposal

Item B-1435—Revisions to Basic Manual Classifications and Appendix E—Classifications by Hazard Group, Including Trucking and Towing was filed and approved in most NCCI states with an effective date of January 1, 2018. This item eliminated several classifications with low credibility and reassigned these classifications to other classifications. Item B-1435 eliminated Code 5069 and its associated phraseologies and reassigned this classification to Code 5059. Item B-1435 was not filed in Florida.

NCCI proposes the following for Florida:

1. Eliminate the following Florida-specific classification code and related phraseologies to align with the multistate approach:
 - Code 5069—Iron or Steel—Erection—Construction of Dwellings Not Over Two Stories in Height
 - Code 5069—Military Reservation—Construction—Iron or Steel Erection—Not Over Two Stories in Height
2. Establish the following multistate phraseologies to align with the multistate approach:
 - Code 5059—Iron or Steel—Erection—Construction of Dwellings Not Over Two Stories in Height
 - Code 5059—Military Reservation—Construction—Iron or Steel Erection—Not Over Two Stories in Height
3. Revise the Florida-specific phraseology for Code 5223—Swimming Pool Construction, Installation or Repair—Not Iron or Steel—Drivers in NCCI's **Basic Manual** for Florida to remove the reference to Code 5069
4. Revise the following Florida-specific rules in NCCI's **Basic Manual** for Florida to remove references to Code 5069:
 - Contracting classifications, (Rule ID: BM-FLPP-C4413)
 - Florida Table of classifications by hazard group, (Rule ID: BM-HAZT-T640A)
5. Revise the Florida Contracting Classification Premium Adjustment Program Workers Compensation Premium Credit Application (Form 09-4E) to remove Code 5069 in NCCI's **Forms Manual of Workers Compensation and Employers Liability Insurance (Forms Manual)**

Florida Impact

In Florida, it is expected that employers will transfer from Florida-specific Code 5069 to multistate Code 5059. Initially, the rate for multistate Code 5059 will be payroll-weighted with the rate for Florida-specific Code 5069, which may result in a decrease in premium for employers currently assigned to Florida-specific Code 5069. The impact to individual employers will depend on the amount of payroll that transfers from Florida-specific Code 5069 to multistate Code 5059.

Historical experience from the discontinued Florida-specific Code 5069 will be reassigned to the corresponding multistate

Code 5059.

The statewide premium impact is expected to be negligible.

Hawaii Proposal

NCCI proposes to revise the Hawaii-specific phraseology for Code 9014—Janitorial Services by Contractors—No Window Cleaning Above Ground Level & Drivers in NCCI's **Basic Manual** for Hawaii for clarity and consistency with the proposed multistate revisions.

Hawaii Impact

Due to the clarification added to Code 9014 in Hawaii, some payroll may transfer from Code 9014 to the governing classification of the business. The amount of payroll that may transfer cannot be identified using current industry data sources. The impact to individual employers will depend on the amount of payroll (if any) that transfers from classification to classification as well as their associated loss costs.

The statewide premium impact is not quantifiable but is expected to be negligible.

Oregon Proposal

NCCI proposes to revise the Oregon-specific phraseology for Code 9014—Domestics—Janitorial Services by Contractors & Drivers in NCCI's **Basic Manual** for Oregon for clarity and consistency with the proposed multistate revisions.

Oregon Impact

Due to the clarification added to Code 9014 in Oregon, some payroll may transfer from Code 9014 to the governing classification of the business. The amount of payroll that may transfer cannot be identified using current industry data sources. The impact to individual employers will depend on the amount of payroll (if any) that transfers from classification to classification as well as their associated rates and loss costs.

The statewide premium impact is not quantifiable but is expected to be negligible.

Texas Proposal

To align with the multistate approach, NCCI proposes the following revisions in NCCI's **Basic Manual** for Texas:

1. Eliminate the Texas-specific phraseology for Code 5183—Asbestos Insulation Removal From Pipes or Boilers & Drivers and establish the corresponding proposed multistate phraseology for Code 5472—Asbestos Removal Operations—Contractor—Pipe and Boiler Work Exclusively & Drivers

Texas Impact

The Texas-specific phraseology for Code 5183—Asbestos Insulation Removal From Pipes or Boilers & Drivers will be eliminated and reassigned to the newly established multistate phraseology for Code 5472—Asbestos Removal Operations—Contractor—Pipe and Boiler Work Exclusively & Drivers. It is expected that employers will transfer from the Texas-specific phraseology for Code 5183 into the newly established multistate phraseology for Code 5472. The starting loss cost for multistate Code 5472 will be equal to Texas-specific Code 5183 until there is enough data for multistate Code 5472 to be rated on its own.

The Texas-specific phraseology for Code 5479—Asbestos Insulation Removal From Buildings & Drivers will be eliminated and reassigned to the newly established multistate phraseology for Code 5473—Asbestos and Mold Removal Operations—Contractor—NOC & Drivers. It is expected that employers will transfer from Texas-specific phraseology for Code 5479 into the newly established multistate phraseology for Code 5473. The starting loss cost for multistate Code 5473 will be equal to Texas-specific Code 5479 until there is enough data for multistate Code 5473 to be rated on its own.

Due to the establishment of multistate Code 5472, Code 5473, and Code 5474, some payroll may transfer amongst the codes identified for Texas and from the discontinued Texas-specific Code 5183 and the discontinued Texas-specific Code 5479 to the appropriate construction code.

Due to the establishment of multistate Code 9014 and Code 9170, some payroll may transfer from Texas-specific Code 9014 and Texas-specific Code 9170 to the governing classification code of the business.

The amount of payroll that may transfer cannot be identified using current industry data sources.

The premium impact to the employers due to these changes is expected to be negligible, and no statewide premium impact is expected.

Virginia Proposal

With the implementation of Item B-1444, the multistate phraseology for Code 5059—Military Reservation—Construction—Iron or Steel Erection—Not Over Two Stories in Height was inadvertently omitted from NCCI's **Basic Manual** for Virginia. This item proposes to add the multistate phraseology for Code 5059—Military Reservation—Construction—Iron or Steel Erection—Not Over Two Stories in Height in NCCI's **Basic Manual** for Virginia.

In addition, to align with the multistate approach, NCCI proposes the following revisions in NCCI's **Basic Manual** for Virginia:

1. Eliminate the following Virginia-specific phraseologies and establish the corresponding proposed multistate codes and phraseologies:
 - Code 5472—Asbestos Removal Operations—Contractor—Pipe and Boiler Work Exclusively & Drivers
 - Code 5473—Asbestos Removal Operations—Contractor—NOC & Drivers

Virginia Impact

In Virginia, Code 5472 and Code 5473 Virginia-specific phraseologies will be eliminated and reassigned to the same multistate phraseologies for Code 5472 and Code 5473. Due to the establishment of the proposed multistate Code 5472 and Code 5473 and the clarification added to multistate Code 5474, some payroll may transfer amongst all three classifications and from Virginia-specific Code 5472 and Code 5473 to the appropriate construction classification.

The amount of payroll that may transfer cannot be identified using current industry data sources. The impact to individual employers will depend on the amount of payroll (if any) that transfers from classification to classification as well as their associated rates and loss costs.

There is expected to be little movement of payroll since the multistate phraseology for each classification is similar to the Virginia-specific phraseology and is only a clarification for when the classifications apply on a policy.

The addition of the multistate phraseology for Code 5059 and the revision to the Virginia-specific phraseology for Code 5651 are expected to have no impact on statewide premium.

There is expected to be no impact to overall statewide premium as a result of these changes.

This phraseology applies to iron or steel erection performed in connection with the construction or repair of military reservation buildings. All other construction or repair operations performed in connection with military reservation buildings must be assigned to the appropriate classifications.

This phraseology applies to the construction of military reservations.

Classification conditions

The following conditions apply to the construction of military reservations:

1. Code 5651, ~~Code 5069~~, and Code 5215 apply only to the construction or repair of buildings designed for the housing, keep, and welfare of personnel.
2. All other operations in the construction or repair of such buildings and all other construction or repair operations performed in connection with military reservations buildings must be assigned to appropriate classifications.
